Facts at 50!



1. Captain Donnie L. Cochran made history in 1985 as the first African American to fly in the outstanding Blue Angels Squadron!
2. Captain Cochran became the first Savannah State University alumnus inducted into the Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame in 2022.
3. Our graduates have provided over \$50,000 in scholarships to approximately 30 undergrad and graduate students since 2017.
4. Two structures sit on the Savannah State University campus resulting from the Class of 1976: Captain Cochran's Blue Angel plane and Bostic Hall. Bostic Hall is named after the late Melvin Bostic who started with us in 1972 but died tragically.
5. Our class has at least one elected official, the Honorable Louise Mitchell, senior elected official, who serves as a council member and Mayor Pro Tem of the City of Woodbine, GA.
6. Classmate Huxsie Scott, "The Voice of Savannah," was presented a proclamation in September 2022 by the Honorable Mayor Van R. Johnson II for over 50 years as an outstanding performer of jazz, blues, and gospel.
7. In March 2026, it was enacted and resolved by the General Assembly of Georgia that the bridge on State Route 204 over the CSX railroad (Bridge ID # 0510075) in Chatham County is dedicated as the Huxsie Scott Bridge.
8. Classmate Charles Garfield Neely created history at the space agency NASA as a design engineer for 43 years and documents his journey as a hidden figure in his autobiographical book *Countdown: From the Science Table to the Launch Pads*.
9. Charles G. Young is one of only two SSU alums to be elected and served as Local Alumni Chapter President, SSU National Alumni President and President/Chairman of the SSU Foundation. The other alum was the late James O. Thomas, Jr
10. In 1991, Commander Welch C. Fair became the first African American to become Director of Depot Maintenance Competition (Public/Private) at the Naval Air Systems Command in Washington, DC.
11. In 1996, Commander Welch C. Fair was the first Midshipman or Officer Candidate from Savannah State University/Armstrong State University's NROTC Unit to become the Commanding Officer/Professor of Naval Science at the Savannah State College/AASU Unit from March 1996 to April 1999.
12. On March 1, 1998, Captain Frank Smith became the first African-American Aerospace Maintenance Duty Officer (AMDO). His tours included many firsts as an African American such as first Joint Aviation Supply Maintenance Material Management (JASMMM) Division Head and Instructor in 1988.
13. Classmate Rev. Thomas E. Williams entered SSC as the first Black officer in the 283rd Combat Communication 7 Squadron, retiring at the rank of major after deployment in Vietnam and Germany, and was presented a proclamation for 36 years of faith-based leadership by the City of Savannah.
14. Classmate Reginald Campbell distinguished himself in music and acting and remains active. From the Glee Club and Players by the Sea, he moved on to The Gospel Music Workshop of Georgia/America, and television and movie roles such as in "The Resident" and "Underground Railroad."
15. In 2020, classmate Evans James established an endowment for the Savannah State University Band that is now worth \$50,000!
16. 2026 marks the 50th Golden Anniversary for the Savannah State College/University graduates of 1976 who are celebrating their achievements in military service, engineering, faith-based leadership, education, entertainment, business and corporate managers, community service, government, leadership, and more!

Keynote speaker
Retired Captain Donnie L. Cochran

May 9, 2026

Captain Donnie Cochran, United States Navy (retired) grew up on a farm near Pelham, GA, where many of the fundamental values and a genuine work ethics were instilled in him by his parents. He was a 1976 graduate of Savannah State University, earning a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering Technology and a Commission in the United States Navy.

Captain Cochran's Navy career included duty as a fighter pilot, flying the RF-8G and F-14A & D from the decks of the aircraft carriers USS Nimitz, USS Coral Sea, USS Enterprise, USS Ranger and the USS Kitty Hawk. Captain Cochran was the Executive Officer and Commanding Officer of Fighter Squadron 111. Under his leadership, in 1994 Fighter Squadron 111 earned the Battle E and Safety S as the best F-14 Squadron the Pacific Fleet. Captain Cochran completed his operational tour achieving 888 accident-free day and night carrier landings.

Captain Cochran's distinguished career also included two tours with the United States Navy Flight Demonstration Squadron (The Blue Angels). In September 1985, after a very competitive selection process, Captain Cochran was selected as the First African American Pilot to fly with the United States Navy's Flight Demonstration Squadron, The Blue Angels in their 40-year history. In 1986, Captain Cochran flew the number three jet and was the last Blue Angels team to fly the A-4F Skyhawk. In 1987, Captain Cochran flew the number three Jet for a second year and was the first Blue Angels team to fly the F-18 in a Blue Angels airshow. In 1988, Captain Cochran flew the slot pilot position flying the number four jet in his final year as a Blue Angels demonstration pilot.

During his tours as a Blue Angel pilot, he flew over *2,200 hours in more than 300 air shows before over 30 million spectators throughout the United States and Canada*. He also served as the Professor of Naval Science at Florida A & M University and Florida State Universities. His final assignment, he served as the Deputy Commander, Navy Recruiting Command, second in command of over 7,000 people at over 1500 locations around the nation and abroad. He was a command pilot with ratings and experience in 9 types of aircraft and over 6,000 hours of flight time.

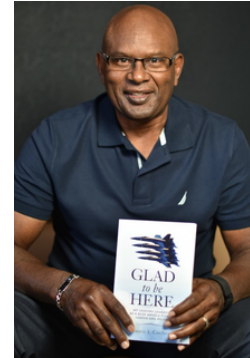
Captain Cochran retired from the Navy in November 2000 and continued his extraordinary contributions to aviation in the civilian aviation industry. He was a flight training supervisor for United Parcel Services UPS and a manager of Aviation Programs for the Coca-Cola Company for ten years. Captain Cochran has received many awards and honors including the Distinguished Graduate award from Savannah State University, selected Black Engineer of the Year for 1989, presented two Legion of Merit Medals, (3) Meritorious Medals, Navy Commendation Medal, Air Medal and numerous other awards and honors. And most recently, Captain Cochran was honored by Georgia's Governor Nathan Deal in the renaming of the old Pelham's Detention Center to the Donnie Cochran Community Complex, in 2016 he was inducted into the Georgia Military Veteran Hall of Fame and in February 2019, Captain Cochran was recognized as a *University System Of Georgia, Regents' Hall of Fame Alumni & Distinguished Friends Award*. In September 2021, Captain Cochran was selected to the *Georgia Aviation Hall of Fame on April 30, 2022.* ✨

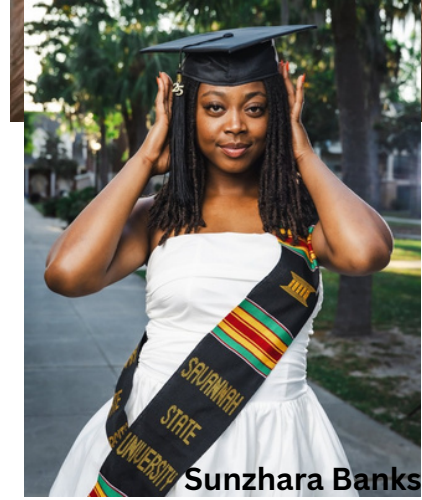
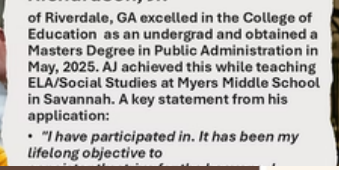
Tainanah Williams of Atlanta completed her studies at SSU in the Master of Public Administration program. A key quote from her application:

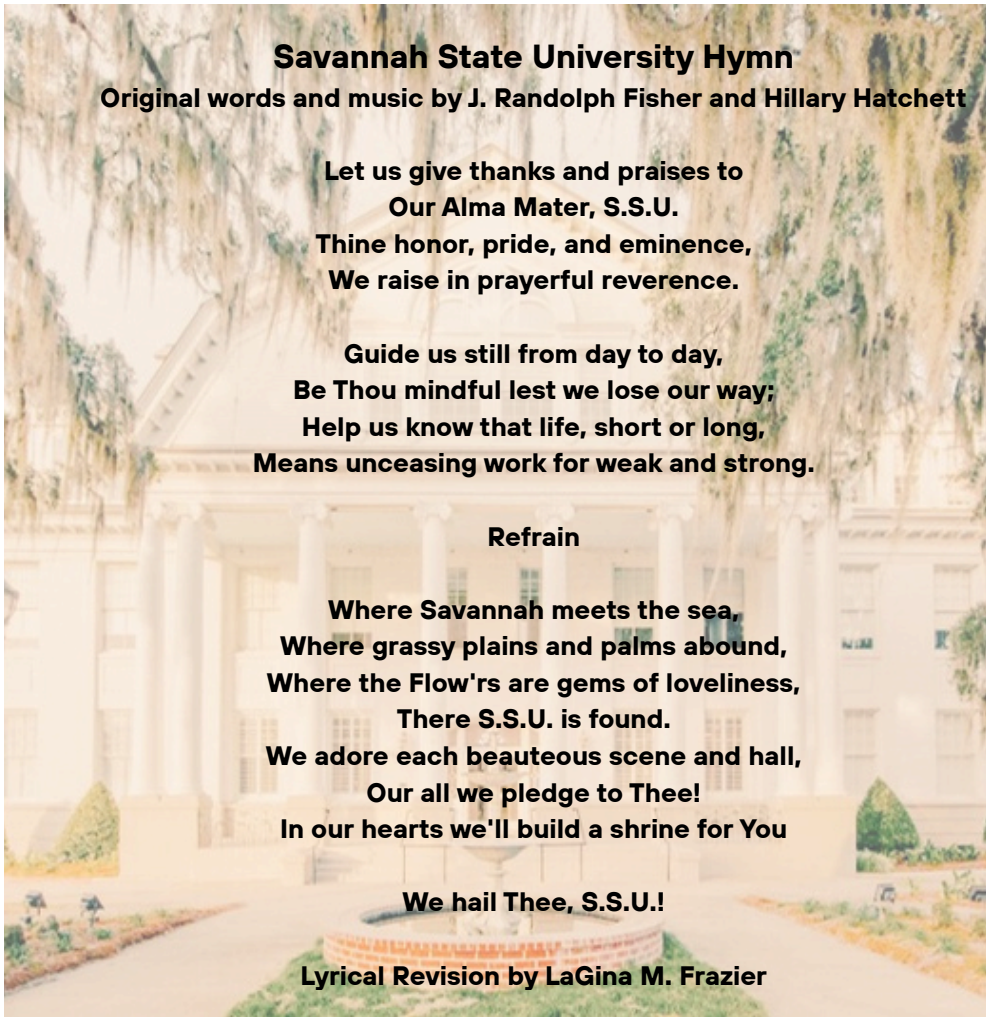

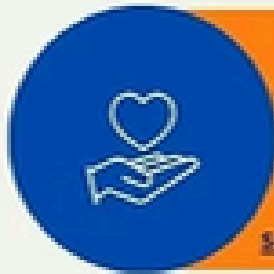
